A Translational Perspective on Transcultural Memory HMM

In Brazil, the United States, and the South American Subsystem: Regional Politics and the Absent Empire, Carlos Gustavo Poggio Teixeira challenges several typical assumptions on U.S.-Latin American relations, beginning by questioning the very usefulness of the concept of Latin America for the field of international relations. Instead of concentrating upon the instances when the United States pursued imperial

policies in Latin America, this study seeks to explain the instances when it did not. Teixeira accomplishes this by shifting the focus of the research from the United States to Brazil and the regional dynamics of South America. Brazil, the United States, and the South American Subsystem is a unique investigation of how Brazil has been a status quo power in the region, increasing the benefits of limited U.S. involvement in South American affairs.

The Allegory of the Cave, or Plato's Cave, was presented by the Greek philosopher Plato in his work Republic (514a-520a) to compare "the effect of education (παιδεία) and the lack of it on

our nature". It is written as a dialogue between Plato's brother Glaucon and his mentor Socrates, narrated by the latter. The allegory is presented after the analogy of the sun (508b-509c) and the analogy of the divided line (509d-511e). All three are characterized in relation to dialectic at the end of Books VII and VIII (531d-534e). Plato has Socrates describe a group of people who have lived chained to the wall of a cave all of their lives, facing a blank wall. The people watch shadows projected on the wall from objects passing in front of a fire behind them, and give names to these shadows. The shadows are the prisoners' reality.

In the wake of African decolonization, Brazil attempted to forge connections with newly independent countries. In the

early 1960s it launched an effort to establish diplomatic ties with Africa; in the 1970s it undertook trade campaigns to open African markets to Brazilian technology. *Hotel Trópico* reveals the perceptions, particularly regarding race, of the diplomats and intellectuals who traveled to Africa on Brazil's behalf. Jerry Dávila analyzes how their actions were shaped by ideas of Brazil as an emerging world power, ready to expand its sphere of influence; of Africa as the natural place to assert that influence, given its historical slave-trade ties to Brazil; and of twentieth-century Brazil as a "racial democracy," a uniquely harmonious mix of races and cultures. While the experiences of Brazilian policymakers and diplomats in Africa reflected the logic of racial democracy, they also

exposed ruptures in this interpretation of Brazilian identity. Did Brazil share a "lusotropical" identity with Portugal and its African colonies, so that it was bound to support Portuguese colonialism at the expense of Brazil's ties with African nations? Or was Brazil a country of "Africans of every color," compelled to support decolonization in its role as a natural leader in the South Atlantic? Drawing on interviews with retired Brazilian diplomats and intellectuals, Dávila shows the Brazilian belief in racial democracy to be about not only race but also Portuguese ethnicity.

This book takes an innovative approach to the study of memories of transit and exile in Portugal between 1933 and 1945 in artistic media. Informed by contemporary debates within memory and translation studies, it develops a translational perspective on transcultural memory and explores its ethical implications. This study provides an in-depth analysis of Daniel Blaufuks's inter-art project *Sob Céus Estranhos*, Domingos Amaral's novel *Enquanto Salazar Dormia* and João Canijo's documentary *Fantasia Lusitana*. It examines the heterocultural networks of signification that these artistic media mobilize to implicate the presence of World War II refugees in Portugal in contemporary negotiations of

communality. By approaching memory through a translational lens on culture, this book also offers new perspectives on remediation, memory transfer and the ethical dimensions of remembrance in the context of transcultural memory and migration.

COLEÇÃO DITADURA Elio Gaspari
Durante os últimos trinta anos, o jornalista Elio Gaspari reuniu documentos até então inéditos e fez uma exaustiva pesquisa sobre o governo militar no Brasil. O resultado desse meticuloso trabalho gerou um conjunto de quatro volumes que compõem a obra mais importante sobre a história recente

do país, e que acaba de ganhar uma edição revista e ampliada, enriquecida com novas fotos e projeto gráfico. A obra está dividida em dois conjuntos: As ilusões armadas e O sacerdote e o feiticeiro. Publicada originalmente em 2002, As ilusões armadas reúne os livros A ditadura envergonhada e A ditadura escancarada, e recebeu o prêmio de Ensaio, Crítica e História Literária de 2003, concedido pela Academia Brasileira de Letras. Nos primeiros anos após o golpe de 1964, o governo militar ainda relutava em se assumir como uma ditadura, daí o título A ditadura envergonhada. Mas com a edição do AI-5, no final de 1968, que suspendeu direitos constitucionais, ela se revela. Em A ditadura escancarada, são reconstituídos os momentos mais

tenebrosos do regime, como a prática da tortura contra os opositores do regime e a violência empregada contra os guerrilheiros do Araguaia, um dos últimos núcleos de resistência política. Os personagens centrais de O sacerdote e o feiticeiro são respectivamente os generais Ernesto Geisel e Golbery do Couto e Silva. A ditadura derrotada detalha os antecedentes desses dois importantes personagens, concentrando-se na articulação que os levou ao poder e também na vitória do partido de oposição nas eleições de 1974. A ditadura encurralada, quarto volume, culmina com a exoneração do general Sylvio Frota do cargo de ministro do Exército. Naquele momento, o presidente Ernesto Geisel punha um ponto final na anarquia militar que

tomava conta do país. Desse relato fazem parte episódios como o assassinato do jornalista paulista Vladimir Herzog em outubro de 1975, nas dependências de uma unidade do Exército, fato que contribuiu para azedar a relação entre a Presidência e setores das Forças Armadas. O quinto livro da série, a ser publicado futuramente, abordará o final da gestão do general Geisel, o governo do presidente João Baptista Figueiredo, em que se sobressaem o atentado do Riocentro, a bancarrota de 1982 e a campanha por eleições diretas. • Pela primeira vez em formato eletrônico, a principal obra sobre a história recente do país é reeditada com material inédito. • Atualizações realizadas a partir de atas do Conselho de Segurança Nacional

Fruto de perseguições políticas ou religiosas, os exílios marcam o nosso actual quotidiano com imagens que parecem repetir o martírio sofrido pelos exilados do século passado. A visão de campos de refugiados e de crianças amontoadas em balsas em pleno Mediterrâneo lembra-nos cenas antigas, como as da “Retirada” dos republicanos espanhóis através dos Pireneus, em Fevereiro de 1939, ou as fugas em

massa durante a Segunda Guerra. A Europa conflituosa e ditatorial gerou a saída de um grande contingente populacional para o território latino-americano. A partir da segunda metade do século passado, as ditaduras latinoamericanas cuidaram para que a rota em busca da liberdade fosse em sentido inverso. Em Portugal, a partir do 28 de Maio de 1926, o exílio foi a única saída possível para muitos dos opositores do regime. Na Europa, nichos de liberdade, como a França antes de Vichy e a Espanha antes de Franco, também acolhem republicanos dispostos a dar sequência à sua luta pelo retomo da democracia em solo português. Com a guerra, emigrados políticos e exilados buscam, em países fora da Europa e com larga tradição de emigração, como o

Brasil ou os Estados Unidos, o porto de abrigo para continuarem o combate contra o Estado Novo. A compreensão deste fenómeno requer uma ampla investigação e não pode excluir o debate interdisciplinar. Mais do que nunca é preciso utilizar recursos vários para a sua análise, comparar estudos com base em realidades diversas, analisar as formas de expressão dos exilados e trabalhar com manifestações políticas, mas também culturais. E, sobretudo, é preciso dar permanente atenção aos novos estudos que exploram a temática nos seus mais diferentes ângulos, como a literatura ou a sociologia. Mais do que qualquer outro tema, o exílio é um campo de estudo interdisciplinar. É com este objetivo que surge o presente trabalho, reunindo especialistas de

diversas áreas em torno da temática do exílio em língua portuguesa, e da sua expressão como fenómeno internacional e contemporâneo. Daí a presença de investigadores latino-americanos, visto ser o exílio um marco na história recente dos seus países.

The Accidental President of Brazil

Numa escrita inexcelsivelmente sobria e transparente, e através de breves episódios, este romance conduz-nos em crescendo de emoção desde a primeira infância rural de uma judia na Alemanha, pelos finais da Primeira Guerra Mundial, até ao avolumar de crises (inflação, desemprego, assassinio de Rathenau, aumento de influencia e vitoria dos Nazistas) que por fim a obrigam ao exílio mesmo na iminência de um destino

trágico num campo de concentração. Há uma felicíssima imagem simbólica de tudo, que é a do lento avançar de uma trovoadas que acaba por estar "mesmo em cima de nos". Assistimos aos rituais judaicos públicos e domésticos, a uma clara atracção alternativa entre a emigração para os E.U. e o sionismo. Fica-se simultaneamente surpreendido pela correspondência e pelas diferenças entre o adolescer e o viver adulto em meios culturais muito diversos, pois há relances de vida religiosa luterana, católica e de agnosticismo à margem da experiência judaica ortodoxa. Perpassam figuras familiares de recorte nftido: os avas da aldeia, o pai, negociante de

cavalos, desfeitoado por anti-semistas e falecido de cancro, os tios progressistas Franz e Maria, o avo Markus, a amorável avozinha Ester (kleine Orna), Paul (o jovem quase namorado que se deixa intimidar pelo ambiente), Kurt (o jovem enamorado assolapado, culto e firme nas suas convicções). A acção é desfiada numa sucessão de fases biográficas progressivamente dramáticas — e nos acabamos por participar afectivamente de um destino ao mesmo tempo muito singular e muito típico, que bem nos poderia ter cabido. Um romance de caracterfsticas Gnicas na literatura portuguesa — e emocionantemente certo.
