It was used as a textbook in many classrooms in the United States and became the influence for abolitionist Frederick Douglass. CALEB BINGHAM (1757-1817) was a textbook author, publisher, and bookseller in Boston, Massachusetts. Born in Salisbury, Connecticut, he was educated and taught at Dartmouth College. His most famous works were on public speaking, including the well-known *The Columbian Orator*. Other textbooks Bingham wrote on grammar and speech include *The American Preceptor* and *The Young Lady's Accidence*.
