There is also a bibliography, a glossary of technical terms, and an index of artists, authors, and composers. *The Bible in Music* will fascinate anyone familiar with the Bible, but it is also designed to encourage choirs, musicians, musicologists, lecturers, teachers, and students of music and religious education to discover and perform some less well-known pieces, as well as helping them to listen to familiar music with a fresh

awareness of what it is about.
