primary sources such as journals, letters, and military reports, Frazer draws a vivid picture of the individual soldiers who served in this division, so often overlooked but critical to the war' s success. After Gettysburg, the Battle of Croix Rouge is the most significant military engagement to involve Alabama soldiers in the state' s history. Families and geneologists will value the full roster of the 167th that accompanies the text. Richly researched yet grippingly
