Carl Flesch (1873-1944) was born in Hungary and began playing the violin at age seven. He was a famous chamber musician, instructor, and

solo performer, who mastered repertoire ranging from Baroque to contemporary works. **Principles of Violin Playing & Teaching** Hassell Street Press Leopold Mozart's *Treatise on the Fundamental Principles of Violin Playing* was the major work of its period on the violin and comparable in importance to Quantz's *treatise on the flute* and P.E. Bach's *on the piano*. This
