What is a dbq essay? Dbq stands for Document Based Question. A dbq essay is a specially formatted essay question that requires students to finish within a limited time. Students are provided with documents to use to source for information.

A GUIDE TO WRITING A DBQ . The purpose of the DBQ (Document Based Question) is not to test your knowledge of the subject, but rather to evaluate your ability to practice the historian's craft. You will be required to work with the documents and use them to answer a question. Writing the DBQ is an acquired skill, one that takes practice.
