One that helps the whole family grow in grace & truth in a simple, sustainable and enjoyable way. Something personal, useful and meaningful that helps everyone in the family, even the youngest children who can hold a marker or pencil, draw what they hear. Somewhere I can jot quick To Do notes for prayer or action so I remember what's important. The blank square is great for that. This is a beautiful keepsake rather than just another boring notebook that gets tossed away after use. I encourage you to use your Church Notes as a conversation starter over a meal such as Sunday lunch. We have everyone bring theirs to the table so that as parents we can answer questions, admire artwork, discuss the teaching, apply it to our lives and then wrap it up with a time of meaningful family prayer. I love this precious time together because I know it is only for a season for us yet the impact will last into eternity. \n \nMost importantly I know this simple act of taking and sharing church notes helps points us all, from the youngest to the oldest, to Christ as the Way, The Truth & The Life. That is my prayer for your family as it is for mine.
