In education, the words theory and model imply conjecture. In science, these same words imply something that is a testable explanation of phenomena able to predict outcomes of experiments. Conjecture implies that information is incomplete, and so it surely is with human learning. On the other hand, we assert that more than enough is known to sustain a "scientific" model of learning. Scholars and many teachers likely have heard much if not most or even all of the information we use to develop the unified learning model. What you have not read before is a model putting the information together in just this way; this is the first one.
