Desde 2007, vivemos as consequências do 4º Relatório do IPCC com muita intensidade, o que deslocou a questão das mudanças climáticas da periferia para o centro da ciência e da política mundial. Tema de especialistas, a mudança climática global se tornou a principal bandeira/problemática de todo o esforço de discussão sobre ambiente. Neste ano, o relatório do IPCC reforça não apenas a necessidade do estudo das vulnerabilidades e dos impactos das mudanças, mas, sobretudo das ações e processos adaptativos. Para isso, as cidades são, especialmente no Brasil, foco prioritário de preocupação, devido à proporção de pessoas atingidas pelos impactos, e, também pelas articulações de toda a rede urbana e do território nacional. Portanto, uma análise crítica de diversas realidades permitirá pensar em políticas públicas que busquem maior resiliência da população em qualquer contexto urbano. Este livro é resultado de discussões realizadas entre 2010 e 2011 pela Sub-rede Cidades, da Rede Brasileira de Pesquisa sobre Mudanças Climáticas Globais (RedeCLIMA), coordenada pelo Núcleo de Estudos de População da Universidade Estadual de Campinas (Nepo/Unicamp). Esta, sob coordenação geral do Instituto Nacional de Pesquisas Espaciais (INPE), reúne pesquisadores de diversas áreas do conhecimento e de instituições do país, na busca da compreensão das cidades no contexto das mudanças climáticas.

Brazil is a globally vital but troubled economy. This volume offers comprehensive insight into Brazil's economic development, focusing on its most salient characteristics and analyzing its structural features across various dimensions. This innovative Oxford Handbook provides an understanding of the economy's evolution over time and highlights the implications of the past trajectory and decisions for current challenges and opportunities. The opening section covers the country's economic history, beginning with the colonial economy, through import-substitution, to the era of neoliberalism. Second, it analyses Brazil's broader place in the global economy, and considers the ways in which this role has changed, and is likely to change, over coming years. Particular attention is given to the productive sectors of Brazil's economy, for example manufacturing, agriculture, services, energy, and infrastructure. Also included is a discussion of Brazil in the world economy, such as the increase in "South-South" cooperation and trade as well as foreign direct investment. Last but not least is a discussion of the role of the Brazilian state in the economy, whether through state enterprises, competition policy, or corruption.

Estudo monumental abrange 350 anos de história econômica para explicar a decadência da escravidão e a ascensão do trabalho assalariado durante a modernização do Brasil. Da escravidão ao trabalho livre - trabalho original e de fôlego sobre as relações entre capital e trabalho no Brasil antes do século XX - se origina da tese de doutorado de Luiz Aranha Corrêa do Lago na Universidade Harvard, defendida no final dos anos 1970. A despeito de sua reconhecida importância na bibliografia da história econômica do país, a pesquisa permaneceu inédita por mais de três décadas, acessível somente em algumas bibliotecas universitárias. Com esta primeira edição brasileira do texto revisto e adaptado da tese, o trabalho rigoroso e inovador de Corrêa do Lago finalmente se torna disponível ao público amplo dos estudiosos e amantes da história. Professor do Departamento de Economia da PUC-RJ, o autor tem como ponto de partida um massivo conjunto de dados estatísticos - que vão da demografia à estrutura agrária, da produção de mercadorias agropecuárias e minerais ao comércio exterior do Brasil - referentes ao período colonial e imperial e aos primeiros anos da República Velha. Corrêa do Lago enriquece a análise desses dados com gráficos, tabelas, mapas e notas explicativas para explorar o tema principal de sua pesquisa: a transição do trabalho escravo ao assalariado a partir de meados do século XIX, marco inicial da industrialização e da urbanização do Brasil.

Since the 1970s there has been a dramatic rise in the Indian population in Brazil as increasing numbers of pardos (individuals of mixed African, European, and indigenous descent) have chosen to identify themselves as Indians. In *Racial Revolutions*—the first book-length study of racial formation in Brazil that centers on Indianness—Jonathan W. Warren draws on extensive fieldwork and numerous interviews to illuminate the

discursive and material forces responsible for this resurgence in the population. The growing number of pardos who claim Indian identity represents a radical shift in the direction of Brazilian racial formation. For centuries, the predominant trend had been for Indians to shed tribal identities in favor of non-Indian ones. Warren argues that many factors—including the reduction of state-sponsored anti-Indian violence, intervention from the Catholic church, and shifts in anthropological thinking about ethnicity—have prompted a reversal of racial aspirations and reimaginings of Indianness. Challenging the current emphasis on blackness in Brazilian antiracist scholarship and activism, Warren demonstrates that Indians in Brazil recognize and oppose racism far more than any other ethnic group. *Racial Revolutions* fills a number of voids in Latin American scholarship on the politics of race, cultural geography, ethnography, social movements, nation building, and state violence.
