Preventing Misguided Reading Heinemann Educational Books

Winfield Scott School is a pre-kindergarten through fifth grade school in the Elizabeth Public School District and is one of New Jersey's lowest income and highest minority urban school districts.

Currently, the school utilizes SRA's research-based Open Court Reading program, a balanced literacy approach to reading. Though reading proficiency has increased since this program has been implemented, many of the students still need to acquire the skills necessary to read independently using comprehension strategies. Guided reading, an effective small group approach to reading instruction, focuses on teaching students to develop strategies for reading independently. The teacher assembles children in small groups by reading level and thought processes, and supports each reader's development of strategies for comprehending increasingly

challenging texts. (Fountas and Pinnell, 1996) After researching guided reading a handbook was developed to help teachers implement the guided reading program in their classrooms. The teacher-friendly handbook provides step-by-step directions to assist the teacher in preparing both the students and the classroom for this program. Topics covered in the handbook include classroom organization and management; suggested materials to facilitate instruction; assessment, both formal and informal; and effective teaching strategies. The main objective of the handbook will be to guide teachers in instructing students to become independent, fluent readers. In conjunction with the handbook, professional development regarding guided reading was provided for teachers in the Winfield Scott School. Using a PowerPoint presentation, the staff was provided with information and assistance in developing the guided reading program for their classroom. The importance of utilizing guided reading was stressed, and practical suggestions were given.
