The problem was the Oshkosh Fire Department changed its inspection policy from two inspections per inspectable occupancy to one inspection annually. The purpose of this

applied research paper was to compare one fire inspection per occupancy versus two inspections annually to see if there is an increase or decrease in fire code violations as they are related to life safety, fire hazard, maintenance, and building and property. The evaluative research approach was utilized to answer six research questions. The questions answered were what are the differences regarding life safety, fire hazard, maintenance, and building and property related fire code violations for each frequency of

inspection, what would be the recommended inspection frequency or standing fire code, and what is the inspection frequency that other fire departments comparable to the City of Oshkosh within the State of Wisconsin.
